Multi-professional clinical leadership:

History and impetus

- Source: history of multidisciplinary, integrated care
- Development of integration over time
 - Incorporation of allied health professionals into medical setting
 - Health educators
 - Community health workers
 - Dental providers
 - Nutritional professionals
 - Behavioral health professionals
 - Cross training of Clinical Support Staff
 - Initial organizational structure and leadership based on very traditional models

Multi-professional clinical leadership: History and impetus

- Mid-to-late 2000's – leadership shift
 - Middle management level
 - Trigger: the “Integrated” Services Paradox
 - Non-physician medical directors
 - “Clinical directors”
- Last 6-18 months
 - Additional non-physician directors
 - C-level management transformation
 - Clinical Director – Medical v. Clinical Director – Dental

Multi-professional clinical leadership: Current picture

- CCO and CQO
 - Roles
 - Collaboration opportunities
- Director team
 - Regional nature
- QI team
 - Network wide

Multi-professional clinical leadership: Outcomes since Jan 2013

- Pilot project – 1 site, spreading now
 - Average wait time decreased 33 percent
 - Production increase by 15 percent
 - Walk-in capacity increased 28 percent
- Quality measures
 - UDS
 - 10 percent increase in top 2 clinical measure quartile
 - Doubled percentage of measures in top quartile
 - Healthy People 2020
 - Increased number of goals met by 33 percent
- Patient satisfaction
 - 20 percent increase in overall satisfaction
 - 20 percent increase in loyalty ranking

Multi-professional clinical leadership: Lessons learned

- Communication, communication, communication
- Learning somebody else's job
- Selling the change to (provider) staff
 - “I'm a (Director/Executive) who also happens to be a _____.”
 - Importance of early victories
