

WAIANAE TEENS

- The two high schools in the Waianae school complex have high drop out rates (22%) and low on-time graduation rates (74%)
- Chronic absenteeism (missing >15 days per year) averages 27% for Waianae complex schools
- Mental health co-morbidities such as depression and anxiety are common.
- High rates of neighborhood violence, family disruption, and drug use.

ACCESS TO CARE

- Despite the presence of established health care providers on the Waianae coast, visits to primary care providers drop during adolescent years.
- School based health centers are a well recognized, convenient, safe and confidential way to serve adolescents.
- Our SBHC consists of 3 rotating NPs, 1 clinical psychologist, and each site run by a clinic manager

GUIDING PRINCIPLES

- SBHC will provide comprehensive primary medical, social and behavioral health services, as well as health education, promotion and prevention services designed to meet the psychosocial and physical health needs of students in the context of their family, culture and environment.
- Use data from focus groups, and hiring providers that are relatable

CHALLENGES

- Contacting parents for consent.
- Educating staff, parents, community about SBHC.
- Communicating with community providers.
- Receiving consents.
- Inability to provide family planning services.

STRENGTHS

- Community engagement & voices of the student
- Direct link to Behavioral Health

- Electronic Health Records with past medical history and social determinants
- Coordination of care
